Call Meeting to Order by SS at 6:02, as motioned by LB and seconded by AR, passing unanimously

Board Report:

 Minutes for September 12th, 2018 (Motion to pass minutes as amended made by AR and seconded by LB, passing unanimously)

Principal Report: (Ms. Oster)

- Student enrollment 2180
- Love Your School Day October 20th from 8am-12pm
 - Decorating the new portion of the A Building History Wing
 - Adding bulletin board strips so teachers can display student work
 - o Adding inspirational quotes made by historical figures
 - Add a bulldog mural designed by a student artist (already started)
 - Add planter boxes to our common areas
 - List of supplies was organized using sign up genius. Parents can sign up and bring in needed supplies.
- Senior Capstone Project Mr. Gagnon presented the proposal for the 'Senior Capstone Project which may be a graduation requirement; this matches the mission statement of preparing students. Completion of a Senior Capstone Project could result in an 'advanced' diploma. Question was asked, why would students really care about getting an 'advanced' diploma? This would set students apart in admissions for colleges; be a feather in their cap; perhaps they could have special cords or sashes at graduation; be a resume builder. Discussion ensued whether it should be a requirement or optional. It was suggested Capstone Project should be junior year, not senior, as

students are already admitted by December of their senior year, so completing the project after that would not have the desired impact. There was discussion of adding it as a line item on their transcripts. Question was raised, should it be a class or something more structured with interim due dates? Would it be more functional if a transition component was added? Could it be carried out through Achievement Hour, so the Achievement Hour teacher was the mentor?

- Freshman Seminar and Comprehensive Health Class-Mr. Gagnon also presented this proposal: two semester long courses would be added to 9th grade and required: 'Freshmen Seminar' and 'Comprehensive Health'. World History would be moved to tenth grade again.
 - Revitalizing the QCUSD Strategic Plan –TABLED.
 - Affinity in an effort to "touch" as many people as possible and to gather the greatest amount of input, we will be reaching out to students, parents, staff, community members, etc to ask them to:
 - Think about the ideal school system. What would be important for our school system to do to meet the needs of students and all other school system customers and stakeholders?
